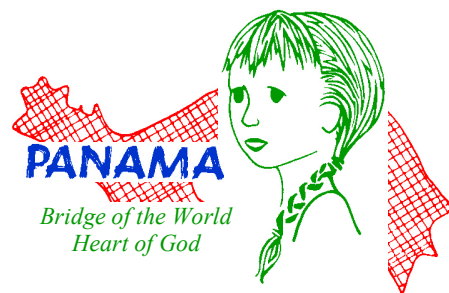

Ngobe Indian Family Conference: with Pastor Roy Rhodes and team from Abundant Life Community Church in Alton IL we saw largest attendance to date—well over 5000—and 120+ new believers baptized.

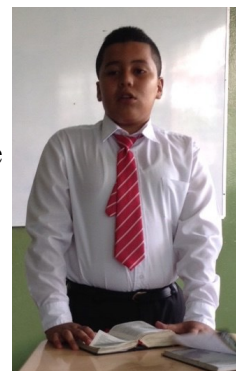
Missionary visa “miracle” (our lawyer’s words): after previously rejecting our application based on a name discrepancy, and on the day we were to submit our appeal they *inexplicably* approved our two-year visa. Government bureaucracy don’t work like that, but God does!

Getting settled in Panamá: we needed a little extra energy this fifth time, to shop for household goods, set up and clean up after storage room

fire, and the best part—getting reacquainted with our Panamanian colleagues and friends!

Thanks for *supporting* the work here:

Evangelizing children

Reaching children for Jesus has been the motivation that God used to call us here to Panamá over 25 years ago. It is what keeps us here today. Please take a look at a few snapshots from this past year:



At the close of a first-ever kids rally with *T. Evangelístico La Bendición* (Evangelistic Blessing Church), all the children cried out to God during the altar service. When they were done, we then had them pray for the adults too—powerful!

Monte de Sión church invited us to speak for their summer vacation retreat. These kids impressed us entering freely into wholehearted worship and prayer on their own initiative. Director Nathalie de Tuñón and team did such a



great job leading worship that we invited them to lead that seminar topic a couple months later.

We visit different churches to encourage the pastors and especially the kids ministry volunteers. Pastora Regina, former Bible school student, invited us to come observe and then offer suggestions for her teachers. As we often do during children's church we teach kids to share their faith using the simple five-finger message: God loves me, I have sinned, Jesus died for me, I repent and receive him, and now I'm His child! Add animated gestures and they remember it well.



The kids love the gospel illusion tricks, such as the unending water pot seen here illustrating God's never-ending love. We just have to remind them it's not "magic," but illusion. About 100 participated in the missions parade down the Interamerican Highway with over 200 joining for the Festival of Colors. Each child heard the Gospel and received a Power-Mark Seeker Series com-



ic book. Special thanks for all the preparation by Pastora Itzel de Moreno (on right), our new coordinator for Colón province.

Training leaders

In this thanksgiving theme I want to be sure and highlight some of our dedicated volunteer staff. Fanny (on left) and Carolina have served for years with exceptional faithfulness, teaching seminar topics and helping organize outreach events. Please remember to pray for kids ministry heroes like these!

Training seminars topics for our leaders address their needs in context and provide opportunities for improvement. They include: effective clowning, praying for children at risk, classroom management, your talents for Christ, kids style worship leading, organizing kids camps, children in world and local missions, Christian and country, and our

favorite time of year, Christmas! Yvonne directed the Christmas





program we prepared, tying together several songs with Scriptures laid out in a dramatic portrayal allowing the children to retell the Christmas story.



Monthly seminars have now expanded from Panamá City also to Colón.

Orphan care: Yvonne visits the baby house weekly. One time a baby had been dropped off next to the garbage, with umbilical cord attached. With heavy hearts we pray for a loving Christian family to raise her and for protection in the mean time from the harmful effects of institutionalization. We have begun organizing mentors to befriend and



love on the children—help with homework, take them out for ice cream, encourage their sports or hobby interests. Screening and training has begun for the first church members who responded. Pray

with us for more willing hearts.

Gracie

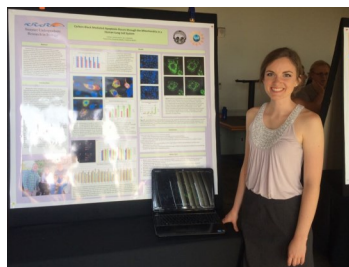
Gracie is the leader of her youth group worship band, plus sings and plays guitar or
